Suspended from the ceiling in the center of the gymnasium was an impressive crystal chandelier, the creation of junior students. Below, columns and arches were arranged in a circle. Chairman for the project was Sandy Bleakney.

Complementing the decor were colorful murals, one depicting three dimensional gladiators with a background of Roman columns, all in fluorescent paint. Another featured a horse and chariot, also third dimensional, in front of a chariot race scene. Mural chairmen were Lynda Sunderlin and Tom Munnell.

Guests were served refreshments from a Roman banquet table and lounge surrounded by columns and blue draperies. Chairman was Karen McDonald.
