

Cianci of Top County

Dave Cianci, Reynolds junior halfback, led the county in scoring during the 1965 football campaign with 85 points on 14 touchdowns and one conversion.

Cianci, who failed to score as a sophomore last year, is the first Reynolds player to ever top the county in scoring.

Last season Verne Swartz of St. Michael's captured the crown with 74 points on 12 TDs and two PATs.

Bill Kerpan, Greenville senior halfback, was second in scoring this year with 83 points on 13 touchdowns and five conversions. In 1964 Kerpan was 15th in scoring with 23 points.

fullback, placed third in scoring with 12 TDs, one PAT, 73 points. He tallied 24 points last year.

Greenville's Frank McCurdy, a senior halfback who netted 27 points in 1964, was fourth this year with 65. He had 10 touchdowns and five extra points.

The fifth leading scorer this year was Hugh McKinnis, Farrell's junior fullback, who netted 55 points on nine touchdowns and one conversion. He scored one touchdown last fall.

McKinnis' father, also named Hugh, set the all-time county scoring record with 127 points on 21 TDs and one PAT while playing for Farrell in 1940.

Joe Spicko, Reynolds junior,

led the county in extra points this season with 11. Long of Mercer was second with 11.

Shawn Lally of Hickory led the county in extra points in 1964 with 11.

Patsy Combine, Sharpsville senior quarterback, led the county in touchdown passes with nine, including three in one game. Bill Samuels, Farrell senior, was second with four TD tosses. Others who threw for touchdowns include Robbie McWilliams (Reynolds), Bill Rupnick (Hickory), and Ron Plots (West Middlesex), three each; Pete Dubois (Hickory) and Denny Mathieson (Mercer), two each; and Tom Jackal (Mercer) and Dave Labor (Grove City), one each.

John Petricini of Sharpsville led the county last year with six TD passes.

Reynolds scored 257 points to lead the county in team offense. Greenville, which paced the county last year with 186 points, was second this season with 216.

The Trojans were the top defensive team again this season, yielding 43 points in nine games. Greenville gave up just 32 points to lead the county in 1964.

Greenville and Sharon each blanked four foes this year. The Trojans shut out six opponents to pace the county last fall.

Grove City was shut out three times this year, high in the county. Mercer, Hickory, Sharpsville, West Middlesex, and Sharon were all blanked twice this season.

St. Michael's, Mercer, and Sharpsville were all held scoreless three times last season.
