

Reynolds School District HISTORY

The landscape of the educational facilities has changed greatly in the area now know as the Reynolds School District. The District is made up of Pymatuning, West Salem, and Delaware Townships, and the Borough of Fredonia. In the 1800's and the first half of the 20th century, over 30 one-room school houses dotted the area to provide education to the children of those times, with the last closing in 1960. Several of the buildings are still standing and in many cases were converted to family homes. In West Salem Township, the last 8 oneroomers were sold at a public sale in 1952, making way for the newly constructed West Salem Consolidated School in Maysville, serving grades 1 through 8, along with the St. Paul's Home School, while its high school students attended Pymatuning High School in Jamestown or Greenville High School. In Delaware Township, the one-room school houses were used up until 1960 in combination with the Fredonia Jr. / Sr. High School and Elementary School in Fredonia. In Pymatuning Township, the students were taught in five one-room schools and attended high school at the Transfer High School which is now the S.M.E.A. Bible Institute in Transfer. The last graduating class from Transfer High was in 1947, at which time the facility became an elementary building serving students up to the 6th grade. The junior and senior high students then attended neighboring schools such as Hickory and Farrell to complete their studies. In 1955, the newly constructed Pymatuning Township School in Transfer was completed, with all Pymatuning Twp. Elementary and Jr. High students attending.

On July 12, 1956, an agreement was reached with the three townships and the Borough of Fredonia to form a new school district encompassing all of these areas. Plans were started to build a new secondary school on land that was donated to the newly formed school district by the Greenville Business Men's Association. The Greenville Business Men's Association had acquired the land in 1947 from the federal government and several landowners. This land was known as the Shenango Personnel Replacement Depot and continued under that name until September 21, 1943, when the name was changed to "Army Service Forces Replacement Depot, Camp Reynolds, Pa." Camp Reynolds was named after PA Civil War hero General John Reynolds who was killed the first day of the Battle of Gettysburg on July 1, 1863.

On February 21, 1956, the firm of Hunter, Heiges, and Gross was selected as architects to draw up plans and specifications for the new secondary school. The State Public School Building Authority accepted bids for this project which were opened February 26, 1959, and contracts were awarded for the construction of Reynolds Area High School on March 18, with actual construction beginning in April of 1959. A formal ceremony was held September 19, 1959, for laying the cornerstone. A complete operation of all public schools in

the Reynolds area was assumed by the Reynolds Area Joint School Board on July 4, 1960. September 7, 1960, was the first day of school for the 1960-61 school term and marked the opening of the new Reynolds Area Junior-Senior High School.

The new school building was the third largest school building in Mercer County at the time at 101,923 square feet, with pupil occupancy of 937 students. The cost of construction was \$1,703,453. and furniture and fixtures brought the total cost to \$2,050,000. The total enrollment of the new joint school district was 2,022. An athletic field was not included in the construction contract, and the community fashioned a good practice field, and the football team played their home games at Packard Park in Greenville. The students adopted the nickname "Raiders." A picture of it was designed by the schools art students during the second year of the school's existence. Blue and gray were the school colors selected by the inaugural class. The schools Alma Mater was written by three students with the music written by band director, Thomas Jeffries. The Alma Mater was adopted by the school board on November 8, 1967.

The Reynolds Elementary Building was built in 1963 on Brentwood Drive adjacent to the High School on an additional 22 acres of land donated by the Greenville-Reynolds Development Corporation. This opening moved the 4th-6th graders at the Pymatuning Elementary School, along with the 6th graders from Fredonia-Delaware Elementary and West Salem to the new Reynolds Elementary School. The Pymatuning Elementary School was renamed Transfer Elementary School.

The first major renovation at the high school took place in 1966. Additions made to the building were an extension of the office/gym hall to include a new multi-purpose room, and the district offices. An expansion of the music wing doubled the size of the library, and added the library conference room. An additional classroom was also added to this wing. The additions of the 100 wing, 200 wing, and 70 wing, added 18 new classrooms, a planetarium, dark room, and a greenhouse. Both boys and girls locker rooms were expanded. These additions created four closed courtyards only accessible from within the building.

In 1969, an addition was added to Reynolds Elementary School, Then in 1996, a major expansion of the Reynolds Elementary School took place adding space for all of the primary grade students in the district. This expansion closed the Transfer, West Salem, and Fredonia-Delaware Elementary Schools. The Transfer school was sold to Winner International and up to recently served as Winner Institute of Arts. The West Salem Building was sold to Keystone

Adolescent Center and serves as the Keystone Charter School. The Fredonia-Delaware building was sold and was converted to a nursing/assisted living facility (Greystone).

The next major renovation took place in 1997, with the addition of the "Forum" Large Group Instructional room. This room features seating in a theater type configuration. An additional area was established to accommodate the electrical needs of the 21st century technology. The 200 wing was renovated to house the District Central Administration Offices. The planetarium was removed and an additional entrance added to accommodate a receiving and storage area. The district offices in the office/gym hall were converted to storage and athletic department offices.

In 2008, the district purchased an additional two acres of land between the elementary and the high school, which was formerly home to the Greencrest Baptist Church, later owned by the First Baptist Church of Greenville. The property was cleared in July 2009, and the present plans are to utilize this property for a future fieldhouse.

Looking ahead to the next 50 years, we have so much to be thankful for. We are thankful to the district leaders and students both past and present for their commitment to carry on the *Raider Pride* that was established fifty years ago.
